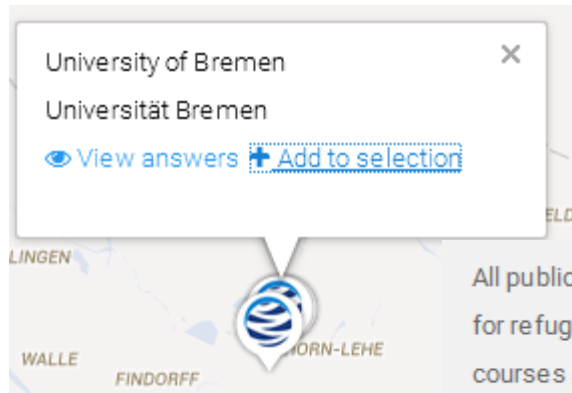


This project is currently in construction. This is the concept : The project works on two levels : An online information platform collects and provides information about the access conditions of Swiss higher education institutions and how to get fit to meet them. It informs about existing institutions and offers in the three domains that make access difficult: finding out how to finance the studies, meeting the language requirements and getting through administration. It also informs about the different existing initiatives of students for refugees. To help with the administrative process the project provides interested refugees with a student mentor in the same field of

- 50%+ of the HEI on the map provide such training in diverse forms

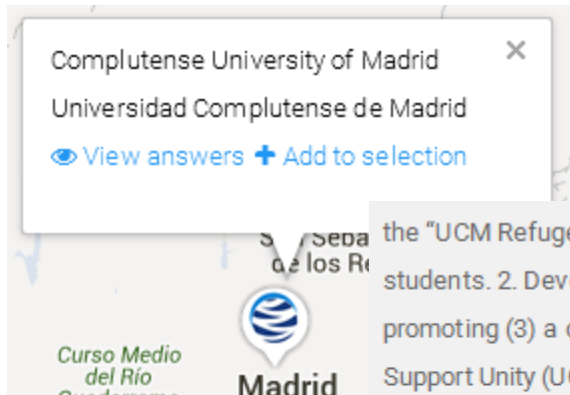


All public higher education institutions in Bremen will offer a joint preparatory programme including bridge courses for refugees without documentation or without sufficient access to German higher education, including language courses and integration. The programme will most likely be starting in fall 2016. In summer 2016 a language only option will start.

Institutional strategies

Welcoming refugees as part of the HEI's third mission, social responsibility – or general internationalisation activities?

- Diversity management engrained in institutional mission
- Intentional, needs-based
- Overarching: outreach/recruitment – teaching and learning – services



the "UCM Refugees Welcome Plan" is aimed to: 1. Social and educational reception of refugees, especially students. 2. Development of values, attitudes and solidarity actions among UCM Community and Madrid's society, promoting (3) a conscious critical and committed society. The Plan is developed from the Diversity and Inclusion Support Unity (UCMD + I) headed by Mercedes Garcia Rector's Delegate. It has two mails: arae@ucm.es & atencionrefugiados@ucm.es attention, & a Website www.ucm.es/refugees-welcome, and an office staffed with skilled personnel (Clara Guilló Coordinator & Marta Amador Assistant coordinator) and volunteers. Some challenges & lessons learned

Operation

- Coordination, cooperation, pooling resources
 - ✓ “A lot of good intention, but ...”
 - ✓ between universities – e.g. language & preparation courses
 - ✓ With GO and NGOs
 - ✓ Welcome centres: accommodation, job, school, university etc.
- Not a recognised institutional goal & activity
 - ✓ done by individuals, small groups
 - ✓ tolerated, but not supported
 - ✓ No real leadership support
 - ✓ Not linked to the institution’s strategy & mission

Perception, conditions

- National situation: legislation, policies
- Public perception
- Hostile reactions
- Refugees – or “migration” in general
- knowledge about migration

Refugees/ Migration - a mission for universities

1. Research & research dissemination

- ✓ Research on refugees & migration
- ✓ Contribute to a differentiated debate
- ✓ Better political and social preparedness (migration savvy systems)

- Citizen science – including refugees
- Research dissemination: facts – not just views & opinions

Third mission/ contribution to society

- Staff & student engagement
- Working with refugees/ migrants
- Collaboration with authorities, NGOs, citizens
 - ✓ accommodation, work, school, university, social & cultural integration etc.
 - ✓ Policy priorities, good practice & research
 - ✓ Local & national strategies & policies
- If not: isolation, social fragmentation etc. at high economic & social costs
- Migration savvy institutions & societies
